



MONTHLY REPORT – JUNE 2026

INTRODUCTION

This report presents the activities carried out during June 2026 under the Dream Bridge Program (DBP), Science Vision Camp (SVC), and Save Neighbor Project (SNP). The programs continued to serve children and families in Kipera Village, with encouraging participation and positive outcomes.

1. DREAM BRIDGE PROGRAM (DBP)

The Dream Bridge Program continued to make good progress during June. Student participation remained strong, with many children attending classes regularly and showing great enthusiasm for learning. Even on days when classes were not scheduled, students continued visiting the center to study independently, demonstrating a growing culture of self-learning.

We are also grateful to have started a new class that meets on Thursdays and Saturdays. As a result, the program now operates through two class groups: Wednesday and Friday classes, and Thursday and Saturday classes. This expansion has allowed us to serve more students and provide additional learning opportunities.





2. SCIENCE VISION CAMP (SVC)

During June, we successfully completed Class 15 of the Science Vision Camp program. At the time of submitting the May report, the class was in its second week. Class 15 officially concluded on 14 June 2026.

Following the completion of the class, students began their school holiday break and many travelled away from the village. As a result, program activities were temporarily paused. Schools are expected to reopen on 9 July 2026, after which we will resume activities and begin registering new students for the next class cycle.





3. SAVE NEIGHBOR PROJECT (SNP)

During June, we had the opportunity to visit a student named Mwaida from Kipera Primary School. Mwaida previously completed the Science Vision Camp program and later joined the Dream Bridge Program. She is currently in Standard Seven.

Mwaida lives with her father after her parents separated many years ago. Despite being a student, she carries significant family responsibilities. She takes care of most household duties, including cooking and caring for her younger brother. Her father depends mainly on small-scale farming and often struggles to provide basic household and educational needs. At times, the family experiences food shortages. In addition, her father is elderly and has serious eyesight challenges.

Because of these circumstances, Mwaida has taken on responsibilities beyond her age and serves as a key source of support for her family. After learning about their situation, the Sharelight Tanzania staff visited the family to offer encouragement and practical support. We brought two chickens as a gift and spent time listening to the family's story. We were encouraged by the opportunity to speak with Mwaida's father, offer words of hope, and

encourage him to continue supporting his daughter's education so that she can pursue a brighter future.
