



MONTHLY REPORT IN MAY 2026

INTRODUCTION

This report presents the activities carried out during May 2026 under the three main programs: Dream Bridge Program (**DBP**), Science Vision Camp (**SVC**), Save Neighbor Project (**SNP**) and Appreciation for **Motorcycle** Support.

During this month, all programs continued successfully with strong participation from students, teachers, parents, and community members. The programs have continued to bring positive impact to education, personal development, and community support within Kipera Village.

1.1. DREAM BRIDGE PROGRAM (DBP)

The Dream Bridge Program continued successfully throughout May, with students from both the first and second phases actively participating in classes. Students continue to show positive progress, especially in English language learning and the development of strong study habits.

Many students are becoming more confident in speaking and understanding English. Teachers have also observed improvement in class participation, cooperation, and students' willingness to learn independently. The library continues to play an important role in helping students develop a culture of self-study, where many students visit even on non-class days for personal learning and academic support.

The leadership of Kipera Primary School expressed their appreciation for the program and stated that they have seen significant improvement among the students, especially in English language skills and the ability to study independently, which was not common before the program started. Parents and school leaders continue to appreciate the positive changes seen among the students, and their cooperation and encouragement remain important to the success of the program.

Challenges

1.2 PARENT MEETING

During May, we conducted a parents' meeting for students who were preparing to join the second phase of the DBP program. The purpose of the meeting was to explain the DBP program and its objectives to parents before registering their children into the program. This was the same approach previously used during the registration of 1st phase students.

Parents showed great interest and appreciation for the program after understanding its goals and the positive impact it continues to have on students, especially in improving English language skills, discipline, confidence, and study habits.

The second phase classes continued every Thursday and Saturday evening after the SVC sessions. The strong cooperation between teachers, students, and parents has contributed greatly to the smooth progress of the program.

2. SCIENCE VISION CAMP (SVC)

The Science Vision Camp program continued successfully during May. Students remained active and committed to learning, and classes progressed according to schedule. We successfully completed **Class 14**, and currently we are in the second week of **Class 15**.

The learning environment remained positive, with students showing strong interest in science subjects and active participation during lessons. Teachers also continued providing guidance and support to help students improve academically and build confidence in their studies.

3. SAVE NEIGHBOR PROJECT (SNP)

We visited Pastor Michael Lumbael at his home and provided support in the form of chicken feed. Pastor Michael has a child who successfully passed the national examinations and was selected to join Advanced Level secondary education.

Due to financial challenges in supporting his child's education, Pastor Michael received assistance from his cousin, who donated improved breed chickens for poultry keeping. The purpose of this support is to help the family generate income that will assist in covering the child's educational expenses.

Although he had already received the chickens, Pastor Michael still faced financial difficulties and was unable to afford feed for the poultry. Since his main occupation is pastoral ministry, we decided to provide chicken feed support to help sustain the project and strengthen the family's source of income.
