INTRODUCTION

I would like to take this opportunity to present the report for March 2026.

This report covers the **SVC Class**, the **Save Neighbor Project**, and the **DBI Program**.

SVC CLASS

We successfully completed SVC Class 13. The activities from the first two weeks were already included in the February report, as that report was prepared while we were in the second week of Class 12. I am pleased to report that Class 13 has now been completed, and I have attached photos from the final two weeks. The class was very successful, and we are grateful to God for enabling us to complete it safely. Class 13 ran from 14th February to 7th March 2026.

DREAM BRIDGE INITIATIVE (DBI)

We thank God that preparations for the DBI program have progressed very well, including the setup of the office, library, and classroom.

To ensure the program is effective and beneficial to students in Kipera Village, we invited parents to an orientation session to explain what DBI is and how it will support their children's academic journey. On March 24th, we hosted the parents at our center. Prior to this, we engaged with the leadership of Kipera Primary School, spoke with students, reached out to parents, and conducted home visits to better understand the children's environments.

The parents responded very positively. They expressed their support for the DBI program and committed to encouraging their children to attend consistently.

In implementing the DBI project, we have established a structured system. The program will include English classes and a library. Classes will be held every Wednesday and **Friday from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM** after school. The library will be open daily, except during class sessions. On class days, there will be a structured system for borrowing and returning books to ensure proper monitoring of reading progress and to protect the books for shared use.

The DBI program will follow a course-based system, with each course lasting three months. There will be three levels: Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced. Due to the large number of students, they will rotate between levels. Each class will accommodate 30 students per course.

Kipera Village faces significant challenges in students' academic development. Although schools in the Mlali ward have performed relatively well overall, the results are still not satisfactory.

Several factors contribute to poor performance: lack of a reading culture among students, limited access to a conducive learning environment, shortage of books, and challenges with the English language. English is often treated only as a subject rather than a language of communication, leading to students struggling to understand exam questions.

We had in-depth discussions with parents, and Missionary Kim delivered an insightful lecture to help them understand the Tanzanian education system and how we can work together to support students in achieving their academic goals through the DBI program.

Yasmini lives with her mother and grandmother. Her grandmother is seriously ill, and the

family depends on casual labor for survival. Due to their difficult situation, we provided essential support including flour and cooking oil to assist with their daily needs.



2. DOSA

Dosa is a young man who is taking care of his grandmother, who has been suffering from a long-term illness that causes severe body pain and limits her ability to stand or move. We provided financial assistance to support medical expenses and ease their burden.
